Over 100 participants made pitch clay bowls which form a carpet of collective imagination you see today.

Imagine the Land is a celebration of local materials, creativity and inter-generational sharing, building a connection to place and fostering ongoing creative relationships. It puts locally-sourced clay and clay pigments into the hands of the Blockhouse Bay and Lynfield communities, students and older people, inviting them to craft bowls together and imagine futures of creativity, care and respect.

Students from Lynfield College and residents from Donovan Village participated in a series of interactive workshops where they crafted hundreds of clay bowls. Students generated a collective poem reflecting on the encounter, facilitated by poet Gus Simonovic. Raymond Sagapolutele (photography) and Lynfield College student Harry Ashley (video) documented the process and captured shared moments.

Public workshops took place at Lynfield College, Blockhouse Bay Bowls and Blockhouse Bay Library.



Ekarasa Doblanovic is an Italian/Croatianborn. New Zealand artist. She received a Master of Fine Arts (Honours) in

Visual Arts from Auckland University of Technology in 2014. Her creative practice encompasses painting and installation with solo shows and many similar Imagine the Land collaborative and participatory projects across New Zealand and Australia.
